Kesher Zion is excited to have Cantor Ted Prosnitz as its Spiritual Leader. He is dedicated to building a relationship with each member of our congregation. Meeting them where they are theologically and ritually, his goal is to support each person's connection to our faith and encourage taking a step up the ladder of holiness.

Hazzan Prosnitz was invested by the Jewish Theological Seminary of America. In addition, JTS bestowed upon him a Master of Arts in Sacred Music. He was also awarded the Hazzan Israel Weiser Prize for Excellence in Nusach and the Sara and Samuel Katz Memorial Prize in Liturgy and Nusach. Hazzan Prosnitz has also earned Professional Development Certificates from Harvard University (Teaching the Ancient Near East) and the State of New Jersey (Holocaust Education).

His undergraduate degree, a Bachelor of Arts, is from the University of Rochester.

Born and raised in Hackensack, New Jersey, he attended public school and Hackensack Hebrew Institute; college (University of Rochester); and graduate school (University of Michigan). A life changing experience one High Holiday season led him to leave the family retail business (PROZYS ARMY NAVY) and pursue the cantorate-first at the Academy of Jewish Religion and then at The Jewish Theological Seminary. He expects to receive rabbinic ordination/smicha from Mesifta Adath Wolkowisk in June, 2023.

Cantor Prosnitz has served as Ba'al K'riah, Ba'al T'fillah, Cantor, and Kol Bo at congregations from New York to Ohio, Michigan to Missouri. He has worked as a chaplain, which he finds is a profound experience for all concerned, in hospitals and homes; and has loved teaching and tutoring in schools, shuls, and seminary. He has sung in performance at Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall. As Spiritual Leader, he is looking forward to bringing all his skills and energy to our part of Pennsylvania.

Our Spiritual Leader is passionate about making study of your prayer, and prayer of your study. When not occupying himself with text or t'fillah, Ted enjoys reading, watching

movies, playing chess, and white-water rafting. Together with his wife Karen, a skating director and figure skating and hockey coach, they enjoy ballroom dancing. They have three adult (all still single!) children: Jared, Reyna, and Rachel.

Cantor Prosnitz is enthusiastic about being part of the Berks County community and enjoys getting to know everyone at Kesher Zion.

Shalom Aleichem,

Greetings, peace to you. That is my greeting to you, as I write to you this first time and that is how we greet the ministering angels when we welcome Shabbat. Part of the beauty of that event is that in anticipation, we spend time and effort in preparation. Seeing to it that there are candles for the candlesticks, wine for the kiddush cup, food for the meal; setting the table and other actions in advance add to our enjoyment of the blessings of Shabbat.

So it is with the upcoming High Holidays. Now we are in the Hebrew month of Elul. This month we can prepare to greet Rosh Hashanah on September 25. Even in the context of the secular calendar, we get ready to celebrate the New Year. How much more so should we get ready to celebrate the Hebrew calendar's New Year. Like most Jewish prayer services, the Rosh Hashanah liturgy is composed of praise, petition, and thanksgiving. On this occasion we especially praise and thank our Creator, boreinu, Avinu shebashamayim, on this Birthday of the World/hayom harat olam.

Beside the physical preparations, how do we prepare emotionally and spiritually? We are not merely mechanical devices that we can flip a switch and our hearts and souls are fully engaged. During this month we can make the effort to occupy ourselves in heshbon hanefesh/an accounting of the soul. It is not an easy thing to review our lives and honestly acknowledge how we might have fallen short. But nothing worthwhile is ever easy. However, there are tools that help. The fundamental first step is mindfulness-awareness of the approach of the Yamim Noraim/Days of Awe. Take some time alone, allow yourself to reflect and consider ways you may choose to change. Dr. Deborah Lipstadt has heard people compare this to April 15th, yet they spend more time preparing their taxes than preparing their soul. Meditate on that!

You can surf the net for daily Elul encouragements, essays on repentance, or peer into a Machzor/High Holiday prayerbook for a preview. Consider coming to the joint KZ/RCOS S'lichot program on Saturday, September 17th to warm up your spirit. Of course, you can exercise and strengthen your prayer muscles by attending, either in person or via Zoom, our weekly hybrid Shabbat service every Saturday morning. Or find whatever works for you to equip yourself for this awesome season.

I am looking forward to meeting each of you and helping you enjoy the blessings of our heritage and our faith. My goal is to reach each Kesher Zion member individually. May each of you and your loved ones be blessed with shalom-peace and wholeness. May you be inscribed for a good year-L'shanah tovah tikateivu!
