

If I forget you, O, Jerusalem...

These words are from Psalm 137. The setting is when the people of Israel were in exile from their land, sitting and weeping by the banks of Babylon. Since the days of Avraham Avinu/our Father Abraham, his descendants have looked to the Promised Land as home. No matter what it was called – whether Canaan, the oldest Biblical name, or Palestine, the name when Rome ruled – Israel has been in our hearts. And in our prayers-we face Jerusalem when we pray; the prayers or rain, successful crops, and sustenance are oriented to the agricultural season and cycle of Eretz Yisrael.

And the people who live there are our family. When they hurt, we hurt. When they are attacked, Jews wherever they may be in the world are essentially attacked. Since the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem in British Mandate Palestine met with Hitler, till contemporary chanting of "from the river to the sea," it has never been about the political governance of territory but the annihilation of Jews.

What is The Hope/Hatikvah that Naftali Herz Imber penned?

With eyes turned toward the East, looking toward Zion, Then our hope - the two-thousand-year-old hope -

will not be lost:

To be a free people in our land, The land of Zion and Jerusalem.

Tisha B'Av is the date when the Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed. It was God's house, and we mourn its loss.

On Saturday night, August 2, at 9 PM, all are welcome to come together to support one another. That night, and every day, we pray for Jerusalem, Zion's people, and the leaders of Israel, and of all nations. May we see the day when the words of the prophet Micah are realized:

"But they shall sit every man under his vine and under his fig tree; and none shall make them afraid: for the mouth of the Lord of hosts hath spoken it." (Micah 4:4).

What is a Tikkun?

It has become a Jewish custom on the evening of Shavuot to have a night of study, which is called Tikkun Leil Shavuot. Shavuot is recognized as the anniversary of the giving of the Torah at Mt. Sinai. Kesher Zion organized an evening featuring five teachers to help us think about and explore what that event and the holiday has meant in the past, and what it can mean today.

The President of Alvernia University, Dr. Glynis Fitzgerald spoke about "Ruth from the Perspective of Shared Humanity." The Book of Ruth is traditionally read on the holiday of Shavuot. Perhaps its most famous passage begins, "Whither thou goest, I will go." President Fitzgerald also helped attendees learn more about Alvernia University. From the Islamic Society of Berks County, Dr. Moro Osumanu spoke about "The Divine Revelations." In Islam, Divine Revelation (waḥy) represents How God communicates to humans. Muhammed is held to be the last of the prophets. But Moses, Musa in Arabic, is a prophet, too.

Dr. Robert Seesengood, Associate Dean at Drew University, taught about "The Septuagint, the Greek Translation of the Bible: What it is, and Why Does It Matter." Among other things, Dr Seesengood explained how the Septuagint sometimes adds phrases or changes words to help fill in the blanks or help clarify the Hebrew text.


The Hebrew Bible (Tanakh) is composed of three sections: Torah, Nevi'im (Prophets), and Ketuvim (Sacred Writings). The Book of Ruth is one of five Megillot/scrolls that are part of Ketuvim. "Ruth and Relationships" was the focus of Rabbi Michelson's presentation. The momentous event at Sinai happened over 3,000 years ago. In the 9 th century C.E. the Jewish philosopher Saadia wrote and revelation and reason. How they are connected to today's observance of Shavuot, through an understanding of what Sabbath means, was what Rabbi Ted Prosnitz explored in his sessions.

Everyone who came to the event enjoyed the variety of learning, as well as delicious refreshments-of course, including cheesecake, and the camaraderie of community.









On Sunday, June 29, a small crowd of Kesher Zion congregants gathered. We did not bless the moon. Rather, we took the occasion of the reappearance of the moon to sanctify the time and acknowledge our faith in God's continuing care. 




