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

How unusual! The first of November, on the Gregorian calendar, coincides with the first day of Ḥeshvan, on the Jewish calendar. The formal name for the month is Marḥeshvan. While the name etymologically means "eighth month," it is commonly called "bitter Ḥeshvan," because there are no holidays or fasts this month. But there is a particularly bitter day this month, and it is remembered according to its secular date: November 9th-Kristallnacht.

The Night of Broken Glass, organized by the National Socialist German Workers' Party in 1938 was preceded by a failed insurrection (Hitler was convicted for inciting this Beer Hall Putsch) and was shortly followed by the Nazi invasion of Poland in 1939, which set the world aflame.

On Simchat Torah we completed reading from the end of the Torah and immediately began rereading from the beginning of the Torah. The very first sedra of the Torah does not begin with the story of the Exodus, the beginnings of the Israelite nation. Nor does it begin with the first man, the beginnings of human history. It begins with Creation, by God - who is beyond time and space.

The first of the Five Books of the Torah quickly accounts for the 10 generations from Adam to Noah. How precipitously has humanity's lot changed! From being given Eden, a Paradise, to being on the verge of destruction by their Creator. Twice the text says that God regretted what He had done: אַרֶּאָבֶה אֶת־הָאָדָם בָּאֶבֶץ ("And Hashem regretted having made humankind on earth" (Gen. 6:6); כִּי עֲשִׂיתִם ("I will blot out from the earth humankind whom I created...for I regret that I made them" (Gen. 6:7).

The text says that Enoch walked in God's ways. We can, too. If God changed His mind-wanting to undo a decision, then we also can change our mind.

How often, after a tragedy, do people ask: How could this have been prevented? What could have been done differently? In the 1930's the Lutheran pastor Martin Niemöller supported the policies of the Nazi party and admired Adolf Hitler. But he changed his mind. After World War II ended, he spoke and famously wrote:

- FIRST THEY CAME FOR THE SOCIALISTS, AND I DID NOT SPEAK OUT-BECAUSE I WAS NOT A SOCIALIST.
- THEN THEY CAME FOR THE TRADE UNIONISTS, AND I DID NOT SPEAK OUT—BECAUSE I WAS NOT A TRADE UNIONIST.
- THEN THEY CAME FOR THE JEWS, AND I DID NOT SPEAK OUT —BECAUSE I WAS NOT A JEW.
- THEN THEY CAME FOR ME—AND THERE WAS NO ONE LEFT TO SPEAK FOR ME.

In Washington, D.C., the very last thing you see as you leave the exhibition space in the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum is this quote.

Based on what was actually happening at the time, in 1933 Lev published a book entitled The German Quarter. In it, he told a tale of a scorpion and a frog.

Wanting to cross a stream, but unable to do so himself, a scorpion asked a frog to carry him across. The frog demurred saying he was afraid the scorpion would sting and kill him. The scorpion promised he would not. So, the frog took the scorpion on his back. Halfway across, the scorpion stung the frog, dooming them both to drown.



People may ask how could God have allowed the Holocaust to happen. Hitler was elected in a democratic nation. God could ask, how could people have allowed the Holocaust to happen.

Serious people seek solutions to problems, not scapegoats. "Be careful with politicians for they do not befriend a person except for their own needs" (Ethics of the Fathers, 2:3). Prisoners who were liberated from the Buchenwald concentration camp cried out against fascism with the phrase, "Never Again." The anniversary of Kristallnacht will be commemorated with a community observance on November 7th. Election Day is November 5th.




